Talking Mats Training

Talking Mats is a visual framework which uses picture symbols to help people with communication difficulties. It has the potential for use with a wide range of people and is an approach which helps them think about issues and provides them with a way of expressing their views more easily.

Poor communication can cause difficulties and consequently choices and life options can be limited. This is true for a wide range of people no matter what their cause of communication difficulty. Talking Mats is one tool that can help overcome this.

The next course dates are the mornings of Friday 26 October and Friday 23 November.

The course will be held at Stirling University, and places will be allocated on a first come first serve basis.

This course is run by the AAC Research Unit, University of Stirling and is supported by Forth Valley Primary Care Trust.

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Who is the course for?

This course is open to anyone whose work includes people with a communication difficulty.

Participants have included Occupational Therapists, Dietitians, Nurses, Advocacy Workers, Service Planners, Social Workers, Speech and Language Therapists, Care Workers, Rehabilitation Assistants, Teachers, Researchers, Psychologists etc.

Clients can include people with learning and or physical disability, stroke, neurological difficulties, mental health issues, the elderly, children etc.

Course Format

The course involves 2 mornings with a month's interval in between.

- Talking Mats is a simple tool but its efficacy lies in the communication skills of the practitioner who uses it. This course is structured to allow participants time to reflect and develop their own communication skills.
- The participants will be expected to video their use of their Talking Mats between the two sessions.
- The first morning will provide background, support and materials to enable each participant to create a Talking Mat.
- The second morning will use the videos as a focus for discussion, reflection and consideration of future implications in their work environment.

Please note:

We must view video footage of your use of Talking Mats in order for you to receive your certificate.

You will only need to show up to five minutes of your video footage. Please ensure that you have watched your video previous to the second morning's workshop and select the part you feel is most relevant.
