What can we learn about Communication Difficulties in Young People with SEBN?


Introduction

There is a growing body of evidence that suggests a relationship between social, emotional and behavioural needs (SEBN) and speech, language and communication difficulties in children and young people (1).

Since understanding and using spoken language is crucial to accessing learning and forming relationships, the authors aimed to identify how many young people attending local SEBN secondary schools had co-existing language and communication needs with a view to developing services for this group of young people.

In addition, the views of teachers were gathered in the expectation this would lead to targeted staff support and development.

Over three quarters of the young people scored outside the expected range in at least one area of language that contributes to narrative skills. Narrative skills allow children to talk about what they already know, and re-tell life events.

Teachers showed very high levels of interest in knowing more about speech, language and communication and how it relates to their work.

Pupils gave reasons why some people were hard to talk to and which situations made communication difficult.



Identify pupil needs and opportunities

Partner with Education staff to develop supports

Establish a sustainable model of staged support communication needs

Speech and Language Therapists will now work with education services to develop a staged approach to communication support in the SEBN schools that helps meet the needs identified through the project stage.
